## DONATION FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

### HOW DO YOU DETERMINE WHAT ITEMS ARE ACCESSIONED INTO THE COLLECTIONS OF THE WYANDOTTE MUSEUMS?

Items must meet the following criteria in order to be accepted for the collection:

- Objects must have a solid connection to the City of Wyandotte. It is preferred that objects have an interesting story to tell about Wyandotte residents, places and events.
- In general we collect from 1850 to 1980, but will consider older or newer items if it contributes to telling the story of human occupation in the developing City of Wyandotte.
- Items must be in good condition. The Museums do not have the resources to repair or conserve new items coming in to the collection.
- Books may be accepted if they meet our mission, enhance our ability to research existing collections, relate to the history of Wyandotte or the Downriver area.
- Duplicate items will only be accepted if the new item provides a more interesting story or if existing items are in poor condition.
- Objects must be approved by the Director of Museums and Cultural Affairs in order to be accepted as a donation to the collection.
- Items that do not meet our mission may be accepted for our education collection. These are items that can be handled and are expected to be used to teach future generations, yet may be impacted by use.
- Additionally, items that do not meet our mission or education collections needs may be auctioned or sold to raise funds for the Wyandotte Museums purposes *other than* general fund expenses. These could consist of exhibit installations, materials acquisitions, special programs, buildings and grounds projects, etc.

### HOW MUCH IS MY OBJECT WORTH?

Museum staff cannot provide appraisal information to you for ethical and legal reasons. To find an appraiser near you, try contacting one of the following organizations:

The Museum staff can give you advice about the proper care and storage of your item, but we are NOT qualified to repair or treat your item. Conservators are trained specialists who are hired by museums and the public to properly repair items while retaining their historic integrity.

### **HOW DO I GO ABOUT DONATING AN ITEM?**

All items donated to the Museum must be accompanied with a **DEED OF GIFT**. This document signs over all legal rights to the objects you are donating.

### **DO THE MUSEUMS PURCHASE OBJECTS?**

We rarely have funds to purchase items for the collection, so we rely mostly on donated material. You are welcome to submit an inquiry to the Museums about purchasing your object. The inquiry should be sent in letter format, and must include an image of the object, the asking price, a detailed description including condition, and provenance information.

### **WILL THE MUSEUMS TAKE MY OBJECT ON LOAN IF I DON'T WANT TO DONATE IT?**

Many institutions and individuals have generously loaned their items to the Museums. However, with rare exceptions, the Museum does not accept loaned items for reasons other than immediate exhibition purposes.
