Sweetest Heart of Mary Church - When Polish immigrants came to America back in the late 1800s and early 1900s, they found comfort and community in their churches. Sweetest Heart of Mary Church was a cornerstone of the Polish community in Detroit. It remains a source of pride and a beacon of faith for Polish Americans in the metro Detroit area to this day. With a long tradition of celebrating Polish customs, "Hearts" as it is affectionately referred to, still connects its parishioners with the homeland of their ancestors.

Andiamo Riverfront (included lunch) - Enjoy exciting downtown Detroit at the water's edge in the beautiful GM Renaissance Center Windergarden.

Old St. Mary's Church - Old St. Mary's is the third oldest Roman Catholic Church in Detroit and the first German one. The first church was built on the present site in 1841 by German Catholic immigrants when the total population of Detroit was not much over 5,000. Not including labor, the original brick church cost a little over \$239. The present-day church was constructed in 1884, and styled in Victorian Gothic by architect Peter Dedericks. The beautiful interior polished columns are made of solid granite and impossible to replace today.

Ste. Anne de Detroit Catholic Church - Spanning the trajectory covering three centuries, Ste. Anne reigns as the second oldest parish in the country with an unbroken history. Its twin spires studded with stunning stained glass rise from a southwest Detroit neighborhood tucked under the Ambassador Bridge.

La Gloria Bakery (shopping time) - Quaint old-style bakery that is a fixture in Detroit's Mexican Town.
